# WHAT IS HOP?

The Healthy Opportunities Pilot (HOP) is a state and federally funded program to help improve the overall health of qualifying Medicaid members and improve healthcare costs.

# DO YOU QUALIFY?

To potentially qualify for Healthy Opportunities Pilot services, you must be in a select Medicaid program, live in one of the pilot counties, have qualifying health need and a food, transportation, housing and/or safety need.

# WHAT DOES HOP OFFER?

If you struggle having enough food, safe or affordable housing, have problems driving or finding a ride, or feeling safe you may qualify for the Healthy Opportunities Pilot.

### WHO IS INELIGIBLE?

You are unable to qualify if: you don't have medicaid, have medicaid direct, have dual medicare/medicaid, or if you don't reside in Bladen, New Hanover, Columbus, Pender, Onslow, or Brunswick County.



# MAKING AN IMPACT

Over the past year, dRC has helped to house 49 families. This includes assisting in establishing a budget plan, finding housing availability, collaborating with landlords, and paying for the 1st month's rent/security deposit to allow for a smooth transition into safe and affordable housing.
