FOR MOST OF HER ADULT LIFE, OUR CONUMER FACED HOMELESSNESS—RENTING ROOMS OR LIVING IN GARAGES, BUT NEVER HAVING A PLACE TO TRULY CALL HER OWN. EACH TIME A LANDLORD DECIDED TO RECLAIM THEIR SPACE, SHE FOUND HERSELF BACK ON THE STREETS.

WITH ONGOING PEER SUPPORT FROM THE DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER (DRC), SHE APPLIED FOR HOUSING THROUGH THE WILMINGTON HOUSING AUTHORITY AND WAS PLACED ON A WAITLIST. WHEN A VACANCY BECAME AVAILABLE, DRC STAFF WORKED ALONGSIDE HER TO GATHER ALL THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION. THE PROCESS WASN'T WITHOUT CHALLENGES. OUR CONSUMER LACKED BOTH A BIRTH CERTIFICATE AND A VALID PHOTO ID—CRITICAL DOCUMENTS FOR MOVING FORWARD.

DRC IMMEDIATELY CONTACTED THE COUNTY WHERE SHE WAS BORN, AND WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE REGISTER OF DEEDS, RECEIVED HER BIRTH CERTIFICATE IN UNDER 20 MINUTES. OUR CONSUMER THEN SHOWED REMARKABLE PERSEVERANCE, WAITING IN LINE AT THE DMV FROM 8:00 A.M. UNTIL 3:20 P.M. TO SECURE HER NEW NORTH CAROLINA ID. WHILE THE JOURNEY WAS FAR FROM SMOOTH, SHE CONTINUED TO RECEIVE ENCOURAGEMENT AND SUPPORT FROM DRC, GIVING HER SPACE TO SHARE HER FRUSTRATIONS WHILE STAYING FOCUSED ON HER GOAL. FINALLY, THE WILMINGTON HOUSING AUTHORITY APPROVED HER APPLICATION.

TODAY, OUR CONSUMER IS LIVING IN HER VERY FIRST HOME. SHE IS DEEPLY GRATEFUL FOR THE KINDNESS, RESPECT, AND UNWAVERING SUPPORT SHE RECEIVED FROM DRC DURING ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT MILESTONES OF HER LIFE.
